OUR SCHOOL POND



Over the summer some improvement works were completed on our school pond and the area surrounding it. It is not an area that parents would normally have a good view of as, for safety reasons, the pond area is kept locked unless in use.

However, our aim is to use it more often throughout the different seasons to allow the children to learn more about nature. We currently have at least one frog in our pond! We hope the children enjoy some pond dipping to see what other visitors we have in there!

REMINDER FOR YEAR 6 PARENTS

A reminder that all parents/carers of Year 6 children need to apply for a place at secondary school for their child. All Year 6 parents have been provided with the information regarding the application process.

It is extremely important that you apply for a secondary school place for your child before the deadline. If you do not apply for a secondary school place for your child then your application will be of lower priority, and may result in your child being offered a school place a long distance from your home.

We have noticed in the last few years that many Crawley secondary schools that our students wish to attend are over subscribed and some children are not offered a space at a school in their catchment area, even though they applied well before the deadline. Therefore, the chances of you getting into the school of your choice if you apply after the deadline is unlikely. <u>Please make</u> sure you submit your application by the deadline of Thursday, 31st October 2024.

CATERPILLARS NURSERY

You may have noticed over the summer we have made some upgrades to our Nursery building at the front of the school. Due to weather conditions and general wear and tear the building needed improvement and we were lucky enough to receive a grant from West Sussex County Council to complete the cladding to the exterior of the building. The nursery is an important part of our community and also brings in extra funding for the school.

Also over the summer, our school classrooms and other areas of the main building have had LED lighting fitted to improve energy efficiency and create better lighting for our pupils and staff, this should ensure that the schools electricity bills are lower in the future. This was funded by the Department of Education.

We are pleased to share that West Green Primary School has been chosen by West Sussex County Council as a pilot school for solar panels and we are awaiting a site survey but hope that this will be given the go ahead in the coming few years.



ASDA REWARDS

If you shop at ASDA you could help with extra funding for our school. ASDA have recently launched, through their **ASDA Rewards App**, a scheme so that when you shop and scan a 'Cashpot for Schools' is added to for your chosen Primary school.

To help raise funds for the school all we would ask you to do is to add our school by following the instructions below. You don't have to be a parent or carer of someone in the school – anyone can join up and select our school.

We hope you will be able to support us, and would like to thank you in advance if you can. If you don't already use this app it can be beneficial if you shop in ASDA on a regular basis. Some of our members of staff already use it and, when you have enough in your cashpot, you can get a decent amount of money off your shopping bill by creating a cashpot voucher.

We will let you know how much the app has raised for our school when we are awarded the donations raised from ASDA. At the time of writing this our cashpot was at just over £200.

HALF TERMLY ATTENDANCE CLASS WINNERS

We are very pleased with the effort the children have made with their attendance this term, and well done to their parents too!

As you are likely aware, one of the education areas that the government is focusing on is school attendance. This is due to an increase in poor attendance since the pandemic. The following is an exert from 'working together to improve school attendance' DFE 2024

The law on school attendance and right to a full-time education

The law entitles every child of compulsory school age to an efficient, full-time education suitable to their age, aptitude, and any special educational need they may have. It is the legal responsibility of every parent to make sure their child receives that education either by attendance at a school or by education otherwise than at a school.

Where parents decide to have their child registered at school, they have an additional legal duty to ensure their child attends that school regularly. This means their child must attend every day that the school is open, except in a small number of allowable circumstances such as being too ill to attend or being given permission for an absence in advance from the school.

This is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. The pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 and key stage 4 have higher rates of attendance over the key stage compared to those with the lowest attainment.



RECEPTION CLASS

Reception have made a wonderful start to their school year. They have settled in well, and they are enjoying getting to know their new school environment. They have enjoyed reading the Kipper books and have made these fun "sock things" that they thought Kipper would like to play with. Welcome to the school Reception class, you are doing really well and we look forward to seeing some more wonderful work from you throughout this academic year.







At the end of last term we asked the children to write down what they like about our school. Here are a few comments from last years Year 2 class (now Year 3).






























IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDING NOTICE

Positive Parenting

Balancing the various demands parents have to cope with isn't easy and all parents can come under pressure or stress from time to time. The NSPCC have prepared a useful guide for parents which shares practical advice and tips for positive parenting techniques that work well for children - from babies to teenagers. These techniques encourage better behaviour and help parents find out what works for them and their child.

The leaflet covers the following topics:-

- Understanding your child's needs
- How can I set boundaries?
- Rewards and discipline
- Keeping your cool
- Building positive relationships
- Who you can talk to?

Positive parenting uses techniques that work well for every child. These techniques will help you build and strengthen your relationship with your child, leading to them being happier, along with less stress for you. All parents can come under pressure or stress from time to time, and it can even lead to them wanting to smack their children – although many parents regret it later. However, evidence shows that it is not an effective way to discipline your children. Positive parenting techniques are much more likely to work and leave you feeling more positive about your parenting.

Children's needs and behaviours change as they get older, and understanding these needs will help you better understand your child. A lot has been written about the needs of children and advice for parents, and some of those needs are covered in the leaflet.

All children need love, guidance and to have rules and boundaries. Rules and boundaries help families to understand how to behave towards each other, and what's OK and not OK. The best way to go about this will vary based on your child's age and stage of development. All children are different and develop and reach milestones at different rates.

CRAWLEY SIGNAL BOX (BRIGHTON ROAD)

Many of you may have noticed the old railway signal box by the railway crossing at the end of Brighton Road. They often have open days where you can have a look around the signal box. It really is an interesting piece of our Crawley history and is well worth a look. It is a great experience for children (especially if you happen to be in the signal box when a train is going past). Their next open days will be on **Saturday**, **7th December 2024**, **between 12:00 midday – 4:00p.m.** The signal box is only kept open and in such good condition due to the volunteers who give up their time to preserve it's history, so your support would be greatly appreciated. It's a lovely opportunity to make a memory with your child.



1ST CRAWLEY SCOUT GROUP

If your child is aged between 6 and 14 years of age there are Beaver, Cub and Scout groups available for them to join.

Beavers is a great starting point for any child aged between 6 and 7 years of age (if they are under 6 you can still put them on the waiting list). The weekly (term time) meetings are full of fun and their activities are based around making things, outdoor activities, singing, playing games, going out on visits, investigating nature, listening to stories, learning how to be safe and most importantly, making new friends. All the activities they do are always working towards a badge. It gives a child a real sense of achievement when they have put in some effort and receive a badge at the end of it, which can then be sewn on their uniform. It also gives the children some skills that will stay with them for life.

JUNIOR PARK RUN AT TILGATE


Tilgate junior parkrun is a FREE 2km event for juniors of all standards, which takes place every Sunday at 9:00am in Tilgate Park,



Government and Local Council Resources

Your local council may be able to help you pay for things like:

- Energy and water bills;
- Food;
- Essential items such as clothes or even an oven.

This help is known as Welfare Assistance or the Household Support Fund. Each council runs its own scheme. The help they offer, and who can get it, varies. Ask your local council if they run one of these schemes. You do not have to be in receipt of benefits to get help from your local council. If you are in receipt of benefits, they will not be affected if you get help from one of these schemes. See below for information on the WSCC Community Hub.

COMMUNITY HUB

WSCC have a community hub for anyone who may need help. You can request support from the Hub, including accessing the Household Support Fund, and where to get advice.

WSCC are focused on making sure they continue to support the most vulnerable people in our community.

If your request is urgent, for example, you are going to run out of food within the next two days, please phone <u>033 022 27980</u> so that they can make sure you get the help you need as quickly as possible.



CHANGE OF DETAILS

If any of your contact details change (address, home phone, mobile etc), please inform the school office so they can update the school records accordingly.

MEDICATION

From time to time we will sometimes administer paracetamol to a child if they are feeling unwell, but it is not necessary to send them home. The brand we use is either Calpol paracetamol 6+ sachets or meltlets (so cannot be administered to anyone under 6 years old). For this to be administered to your child you will have needed to have signed a form giving your permission. We will always telephone you to get your permission before we administer any paracetamol, but without the signed consent form we cannot administer it in any event. If you have already signed a permission slip you do not need to do anything else. The above is also relevant for antihistamine's. We use Piriton, but only if the parent has provided written consent and also verbal consent just before it is administered.

TRIM TRAIL AND TYRE TRAIL

At the end of the school day it has been noted that parents are allowing their children to play on the trim trail outside the classrooms. If you do allow your child to use the trim trail (or tyres) at drop off/collection time it is **your responsibility** to ensure they use it safely. Please keep an eye on your children at all times during drop off/collection to/from school to ensure their safety.

MOBILE PHONES

Please can you remind your child that if they bring a mobile phone to school with them, they must **not** use the phone whilst on the school premises. All phones must be turned off when your child has arrived at school, and handed to their class teacher. All phones will be returned at the end of the school day.

BIRTHDAYS AND TREATS

We love birthdays, and we love celebrating them even more! If you provide sweets for a class in order to celebrate your child's birthday, we would ask that you ensure they are individually wrapped, nut free and, if possible, vegetarian. This will mean all of your child's classmates can celebrate their birthday with them. We are not able to hand out any cakes or sweets that are homemade.

Also, from time to time throughout the school year, we will give out sweet treats to children. We will ensure we always meet a child's dietary requirements. Please inform the school if you do not want your child to be given any sweet treats.

ASTHMA INHALERS/AUTO INJECTORS

If we hold an asthma inhaler or auto injector for your child, please be aware that we need two, one in the classroom, and one in our medical room. When that item is out of date we will contact you and ask you to provide us ones that are in date. Please make sure that you provide us in date items as a matter of priority. It is for your child's safety and must be acted upon immediately.

FILMS AT CHRISTMAS AND EASTER (AND THROUGHOUT THE SCHOOL YEAR)

Mainly at Christmas and Easter time we will sometimes arrange for the children to watch a film as an end of term treat. The films will either be a 'U' or 'PG' certificate. We would never show a film that we judged to be inappropriate. However, if you do not wish your child to watch a 'PG' certificate film then please let the school office know so that a different film can be chosen for your child's class to watch.

No Nuts Reminder

Please remember that we are a 'No Nuts' school. This means that no food brought into school by either children or staff should contain nuts. This includes Nutella (there are other alternative chocolate spreads available that do not contain nuts).
